Your introduction paragraph should include a background view of the topic showing awareness of the crisis. It should also have a brief introduction to your country's thoughts on the topic. Lastly, it can include past actions done by the international community to tackle the problem.

Your body paragraph/s is where you show the complete and ample perspective of your country's standpoints. If your government has taken action in the matter or has any plans, this is the place to state them. We suggest including possible solutions you may have to attempt to solve the problem at hand. Remember, this paragraph is where your position paper's real strength and solidity will be shown; therefore, we encourage you to sustain coherent and logical writing for your arguments and allegations.

At last, we have the conclusion paragraph to help you give closure to your thoughts and perspective. You can also include possible solutions that you may want to share during the debate and will help you resolve the different eventualities. You may also have a possible

reflection or consideration that may help you bring cessation to your paper.

PD: This paper includes the expected aesthetic requirements; thus, we further recommend using the font, spacing, and alignment of this document. From this point on, you should refrain yourself from using personal pronouns and should strictly refer to as “the delegation of X.” We remind you to stick to your country’s position going forward and abstain from using viewpoints that may contradict your country’s views. Lastly, the position paper is expected to have an extension of a minimum of 1 page and a maximum of 2.
